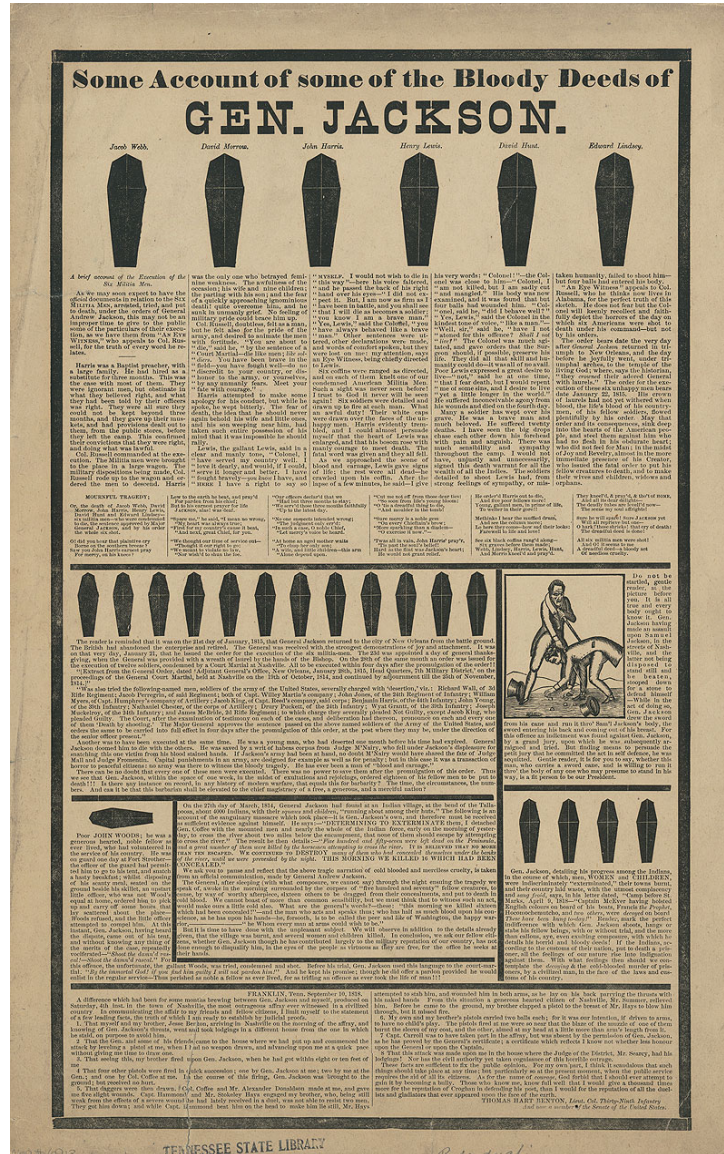


Andrew Jackson GOOD, EVIL AND THE PRESIDENCY



“Some Accounts of the Bloody Deeds of Andrew Jackson” (1828). An anti-Jackson handbill issued during the 1828 presidential campaign, known at the time as the “coffin handbill.” In 1815 six soldiers under Jackson’s command were executed for desertion.
